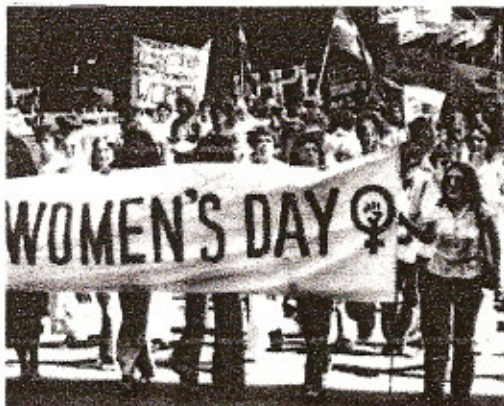

OREGON POETS

An Italian diplomat was posted to England in the mid nineteenth century. After his tour of duty he took up residence in that country. He had two children. His son, Dante Gabriel Rossetti, and a daughter, Christina Rossetti.

Gabriel Rossetti considered himself primarily a painter who wrote poetry.

I flatly do not agree with him as I have never seen a painting by Rossetti. Many of his poems I know by heart.

As is said in my home country Dante was slightly "touched in the head". When his first wife died he had his poems buried with her, a rather macabre gesture to begin with. Later, in an even more macabre gesture, he had her body dug up so he might retrieve the poems.

That must have been an odiferous gesture.

One of his poems was so distinctive I almost memorized it as I read it. Here are the opening lines:

"Folks say a wizard to a northern king
At Christmas tide such wondrous things did show
That through one window he could see the spring
And through another the fruited summer's glow."

The poem closes with the lines:

"Remember me a little then I pray,
The idle singer of an empty day."

Even so, I consider his sister, Christina Rossetti, the better poet. She is perhaps remembered most for her long and epic poem "Goblin Market". Reading it is like listening to a ghost story told at twilight. It is not a frightful but is a frightening poem. Inwardly I shivered as I read it. It is a goose bump rouser.

Her "Song is a Sad Song" is actually a funeral song. Nevertheless it is beautiful and carries the hope of redemption.

"When I am dead, my dearest,
Sing no sad songs for me;
Plant thou no roses at my head,
Nor shady laurel tree:
Be the green grass above me
With showers and dewdrops wet
And if thou wilt, remember,
And if thou wilt, forget."

It is not my purpose to unearth any Rossettis in Deadwood. Yes, we have no Italians in our hills. But it has been said that "shared experience" is the greatest human good".

Through poetry we can all share even our most intimate ideas and emotions, and not merely in Deadwood but in the entire littoral from the sea to the desert.

If I should die tomorrow I would feel I have been touched by god, whatever god might be. We call God him but whatever God is, it would be sexless and all encompassing. It could be you and me, as Pierre de Charden averred and was excommunicated by the Catholic Church for so averring.

Below is an email from Eric Schlosser, the author of *Fast Food Nation*, and Gary Hirshberg, chairman of Stonyfield Farm. Eric and Gary created a petition on SignOn.org that is getting a lot of attention.

The FDA is on the brink of approving genetically engineered salmon for human consumption. This would be the **first genetically engineered animal on supermarket shelves** in the United States.

The salmon is engineered to produce growth hormones year-round that cause the fish to grow at twice the normal rate. The government already requires labels to tell us if fish is wild-caught or farm-raised—don't we also have a right to know if our salmon is genetically engineered? Without labels, we'll never know.

More than forty countries, including Russia and China, already require labels on genetically engineered foods. **As Americans, we firmly believe that we deserve the same right to know what we are eating.**

That's why I created a petition to U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) on SignOn.org, which says:

Commissioner Hamburg, we urge the FDA to require the mandatory labeling of genetically engineered foods. We have a right to know about the food we eat and what we feed our families, but under current FDA regulations, we don't have that ability when it comes to genetically engineered foods.

Polls show that more than 90% of Americans support mandatory labeling. Such near-unanimity in public opinion is rare. Please listen to the American public and mandate labeling of genetically engineered foods.

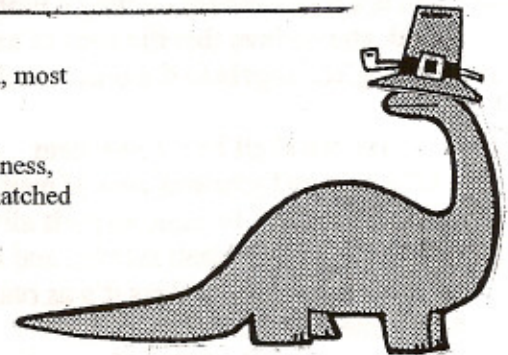
