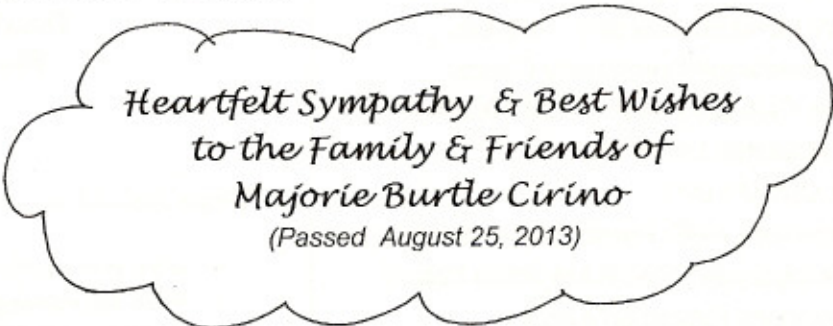

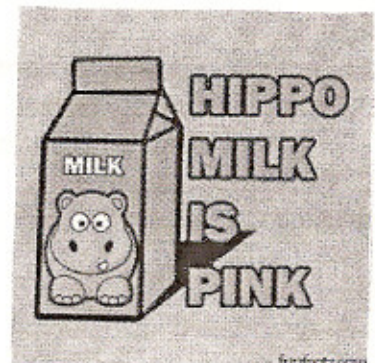
Our lives are the stuff dreams are made of for both are rounded by a sleep.

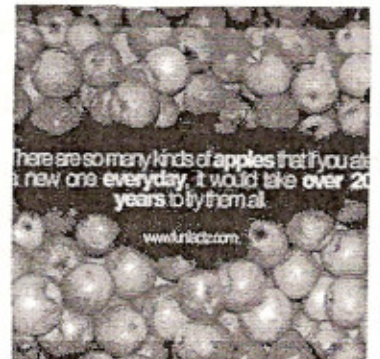

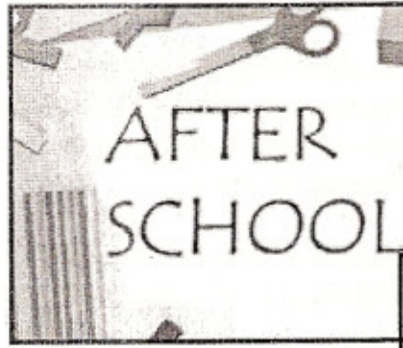

Adventures of Me and My Shadow

I always take my canine companion and protector, Shadow, with me on my nightly deliveries. Last week we pulled up for a delivery on Deadwood Creek Road, which happened to have the box under an apple tree. As we approached the box, I saw the leaves on the tree blowing. By the time I realized it wasn't the wind, we were already stopped. The tree was just shaking like crazy.

Shadow just went bezerk, growling and barking and carrying on. Well, I threw the paper in the box and got out of there quickly. I don't know who was the most startled, me, Shadow, or the Bear.

This time of year, as most of you know, the salmon are coming up the creeks and the bears are very active, particularly at night until early dawn. So if you are driving at night, please be mindful and drive carefully.

Role of oxygen in breathing

For thousands of years people did not know why we breathe air. Plato and Aristotle believed that nutrients from food were burned in the heart, making the flame that brought warmth and life to the body. They thought that the air that we breathe helped to keep the fire controlled. Oxygen was discovered to be a chemical element, and vital in breathing, by 18th century scientists such as Joseph Priestley, Carl Wilhelm Scheele and Antoine-Laurent Lavoisier. It was Lavoisier, who is regarded as the founder of modern chemistry, who named oxygen.

Oxygen is necessary for the chemical reactions inside a cell. (The word *oxygen* is from the Greek meaning *acid burning*.) These cellular respirations break up nutrients from food and set free the energy for driving the cell's life process. A pretty important process considering you breathe up to 23 000 times a day.
