

With one hand, the Lane County Commissioners asked Governor Kate Brown to declare our county in a state of "drought emergency"! Then, with the other, prepares to help two Eugene companies — Delta Sand & Gravel Co. and Knife River Corp. — secure extra Willamette River water for their concrete mixing operations.

"It's really important that we manage the water coming off the main stem of the Willamette to the benefit of the community," said Lane County Commissioner Pat Farr.

Mr. Farr's comment indicates that he believes that what benefits business will ultimately benefit the community. We have seen time and time again, that this "trickle-down" economic mindset more often results in untold damage. It's well past time that the environment's/community's interests are prioritized above that of corporate business.
