I've been asked for more information the \$35 fee for road maintenance which is on our May ballot. People have asked me if I know why a flat fee was chosen and what assurance we have that the money will be spent for dust control and rural road maintenance, including prompt clearing of slides.

You can see Lane County's plans in writing on line at: <http://www.lanecounty.org/vrf>. Along with the list of services to maintain and add back, you will see that there is a citizens oversight committee that will make sure the funds are spent as promised. In addition, I have had email and face to face conversations with the Transportation Planning Program Supervisor who has assured me that this fee will be used to fund rural needs I care about—dust control and timely removal of slides. Without this fee, staffing will be further reduced. If that happens we risk being cut off because Lane County simply does not have the crews to clear slides. Lane County had a larger road crew when we had so many slides in 1996. How long would it take to clear a similar number with the smaller road crew staff we have today? For me, it is wise insurance to pay less than ten cents a day to have dust control, roads that stay open, and fewer of those pot holes that keep throwing my alignment out and wears out my tires before their time.

In my conversations with the Program Supervisor and what I heard by sitting through public hearings on this matter, I can tell you thought was given to many possible way of funding much needed road maintenance. They looked at everything from gas taxes to toll roads. This fee was the only one available that did not require Lane County to set up a plan to administer it. The state of Oregon has this flat fee option in place. With this plan, almost all the money collected goes to directly to road maintenance, not to hiring more staff to set up and maintain a system to collect money for roads.

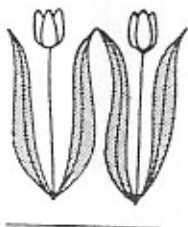
