Celebrate with me & help local asylum seekers from Julie Daniel

Dear Deadwood Family,
On November 16th, after 47 years as a “permanent resident”, that is, a Green Card holder, I will take the oath and become a naturalized US citizen. Many people have asked me why I would want to, given the troubled state of the nation. Like many others, I’ve been angered and upset by the relentless assault on civil liberties, minorities and the environment under the current administration. Only citizens can vote, and each vote is more important than ever. The occasion of becoming a citizen also gives me a unique opportunity to have a little activist fun. To celebrate my ability to vote, I’m raising money for GLAD (Grupo Latino de Accion Directa of Lane County) to jumpstart a program that will match good hearted pro-bono attorneys with local asylum seekers. Eugene Immigration attorney Raquel Hecht, GLAD board member, reports that dozens of people seeking asylum contact her office each month. She has to turn most of them away. Asylum seekers are among the most vulnerable people in our community. They are recent arrivals, generally have no money, and are in desperate situations. Hecht has been widely recognized for her skill and for the number of pro-bono cases

she takes on, but she cannot meet the need single handed. We need more attorneys willing to step up and “adopt” an asylum seeker. GLAD is poised to make that happen.

Getting a residency visa or becoming a naturalized citizen is no picnic. Those fleeing violence and oppression, who speak limited or no English, and lack funds to hire legal representation face a terrifying bureaucratic minefield. I’m a white, financially stable, European born, long-time resident with three US born children and I found the process expensive, time consuming and intimidating. It took a year, \$1,000 in fees and travel expenses, and I did not need a lawyer or interpreter to help me. The generous folk at Claim 52 have kindly agreed to host a post oath taking party. Please join me November 16th and lend a hand to some neighbors who need our help.

I hope to raise \$100 for every year I’ve been here: \$4,700!

On Saturday, 10/20, about 15 adults and children came to the Deadwood Pioneer Cemetery – some mowed, some pruned holly and English Ivy, some cleaned, and some just came to visit and see what was going on.
