## **Florence Farmers Market Opens for 2019 Season**

Florence Farmers Market will open for the season on Tuesday, May 14, 2019, from 3-6 p.m. The Market will be open each Tuesday through Oct. 15. It is located next to the Veteran's Memorial Park, at the intersection of Kingwood and Bay streets. Florence Farmers Market is open to the public and offers free music and education opportunities, as well as local foods for sale from Market vendors.

Vendors at the Market include farmers and food producers located within 60 miles of Florence offering a variety of fresh vegetables, fruits and prepared foods. Florence Farmers Market is committed to increasing access to healthy local foods. The Market will again be offering the Double Up Food Bucks program for SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) recipients. This program allows SNAP shoppers to redeem up to \$10 in matching funds to purchase fresh, local produce. In 2018, the first season for Florence Farmers Market, over 70 low-income families took advantage of the program.

Confirmed vendors this season include L'Etoile Farm, Ambrosia Farm, Fog Hollow Farm, Fair Valley Farm, Greenfields Farm, Ortolan Gardens, Yachats Brewing + Farmstore, Vine to Table, Estill Blueberries, Kickin' Pickles, Upriver's Green Valley, Rainforest Mushrooms, Aronia Bijou Bloom and Marcy's Sourdough and Sweet.

Education and community booths for the 2019 season will again include Lane County Master Recyclers providing free reusable shopping and produce bags, as well as information on reducing food waste. The

Cooking Skills Education booth will also be returning, offering free cooking demonstrations using fresh, seasonal Market produce; recipes and samples are included. Each Market day also offers activities for kids. For opening day, Siuslaw Elementary School's Kindness Club will be teaching kids how to create newspaper planting pots. The new Local Matters education series will be available during the first three Market days from 4-5 p.m.

The Central Coast Ranger District – Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area (the District) of the Siuslaw National Forest would like to extend our gratitude for the community involvement at the public meeting that was held May 4<sup>th</sup> to discuss the proposed Deadwood Creek Restoration Project (the Project).

We would also like to thank the community for the use of the community center and Johnny Sundstrom for kindly providing opening remarks.

Over 20 interested parties attended, many of which provided us with questions and concerns about the Project. The Project planning team is now in the process of considering these comments, ideas, and concerns received at the meeting as well as input received during the scoping period. The team will refine the proposed action if needed based on this input.

During the public meeting, we received requests for a printed map with better resolution. The District has prepared printed maps that are available at Deadwood Country Market and the Mapleton Public Library (88148 Riverview Avenue, Mapleton) – thank you Deadwood Country Market and the Mapleton Public Library for providing this service.

Maija Corliss with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Interagency Office, will discuss Forest Fire Management by the BLM and US Forest Service, and

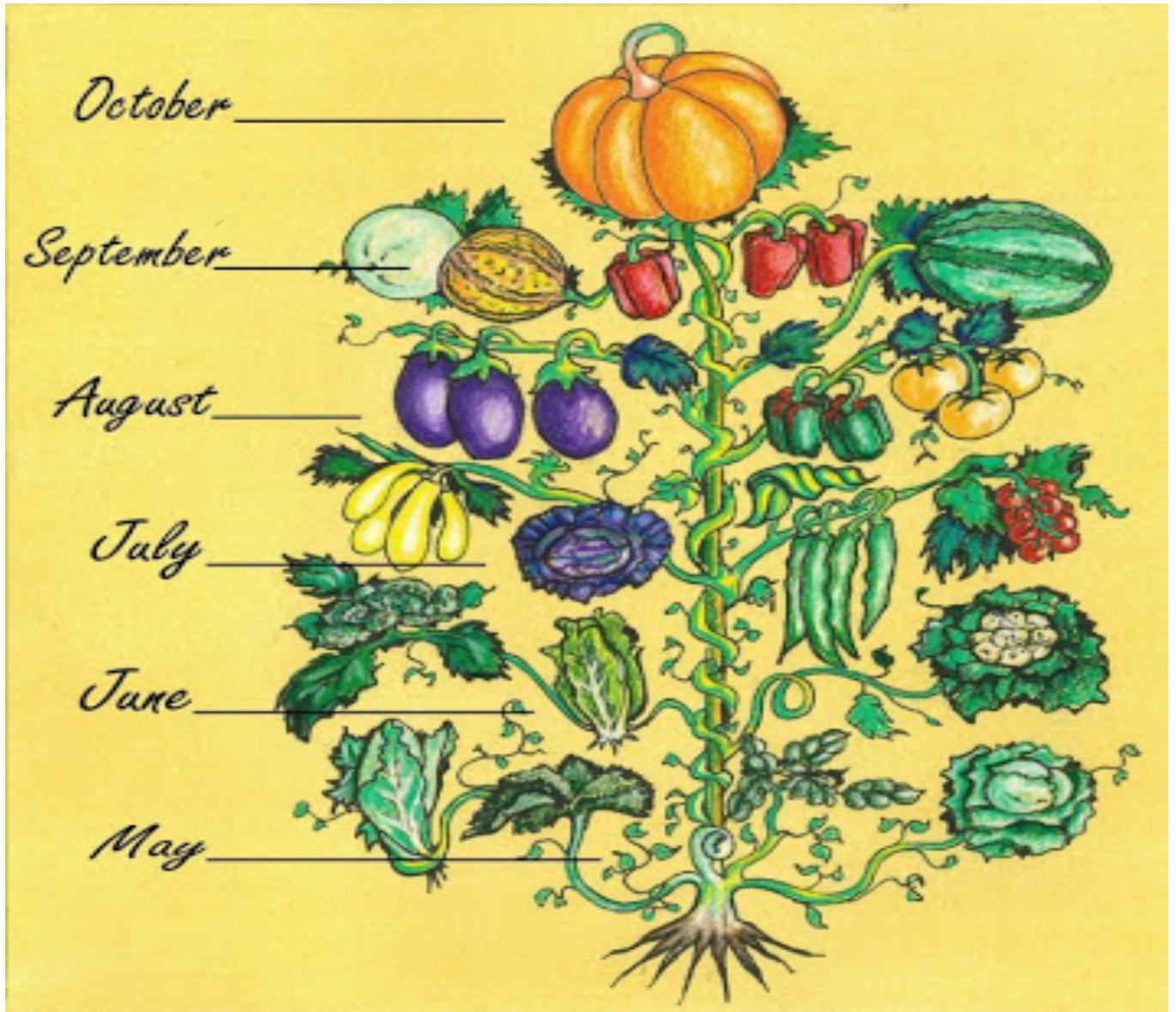
Tony Miller, Fire Prevention Officer with Siuslaw Valley Fire and Rescue, will talk about prevention and defensible space strategies.
