which is a gate through which her life keeps walking.

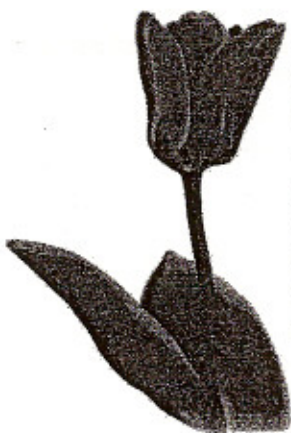
She can't see

Donna Love, Author and Peace Activist, to Speak at Deadwood Community Center

Topics include her three published books, all written since turning 80, and strategies for writing memoirs.

Donna Rankin Love, author and sister of Florence residents, David and Dianne Rankin, will be speaking in the Deadwood Community Center Wednesday, May 23, at 6:30. Through her three books, all published since her 80th birthday, she will inspire her audience on three important aspects of life.

Her first book, *Tell Me a Story*, started as a Christmas gift for her family. The 42 short stories comprise a memoir. Love discovered that memories and short stories are a perfect match – and writing memoirs can be less intimidating. Love reminds us, "You don't have to start at the beginning."

To Make the House Complete, chronicles 14 years as Love moves into four houses and a marriage, each needing construction. Ranging from two casas in Mexico to a farm house on the Umpqua River to a beach cottage in Capitola, California, plus a 10-year second marriage, she recounts her efforts to make them, and her life, better. In the end, she's keeping the cottage.

Walking for Our Lives tells of three historic peace marches of the 1980's totaling over 5,000 miles. The first involved walking 3,700 miles from Los Angeles to Washington, DC in the Great Peace March of 1986. The following year, 230 Americans landed in Leningrad (St Petersburg) and walked with 230 Soviets to Moscow. Then Soviets traveled for a peace walk in the United States. Love says, "I grew from a complacent homemaker into a passionate peacemaker, and into a life where anything is possible and one person does make a difference."

Donna Love believes, "Writing memoir contributes to personal peace, peace within families, and in communities."

She will discuss memoir writing and read excerpts from her books and will be accompanied by her publisher, Patricia Hamilton, of Park Place Publications, who will explain self-publishing and the changing world of books. Following the discussion, Love will sign purchased books.

The book event is free.

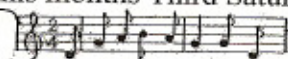
